## **Sculpture Syllabus**

**Course Description:** Course will introduce multiple forms of sculpture including clay, paper mache, found object and wire. You will learn the vocabulary, history and techniques that are related to sculpture.

**Course Objective:** The objective for the class is that you understand and are able to use the elements and principles of art when making a sculpture. I also hope you will gain knowledge of art history and many different art mediums, styles, techniques. Another goal for the class is that you will be able to appropriately critique your own and others' artwork.

Some of the projects that will help achieve the objective are:

- Pinch, coil and slab pots
- Large paper mache sculptures
- Wheel Thrown pots
- Wire Sculptures

Critiques will be held after most projects. You will be expected to have work done before the critique and participate in the discussions.
